## Key Component of Technical Cooperation

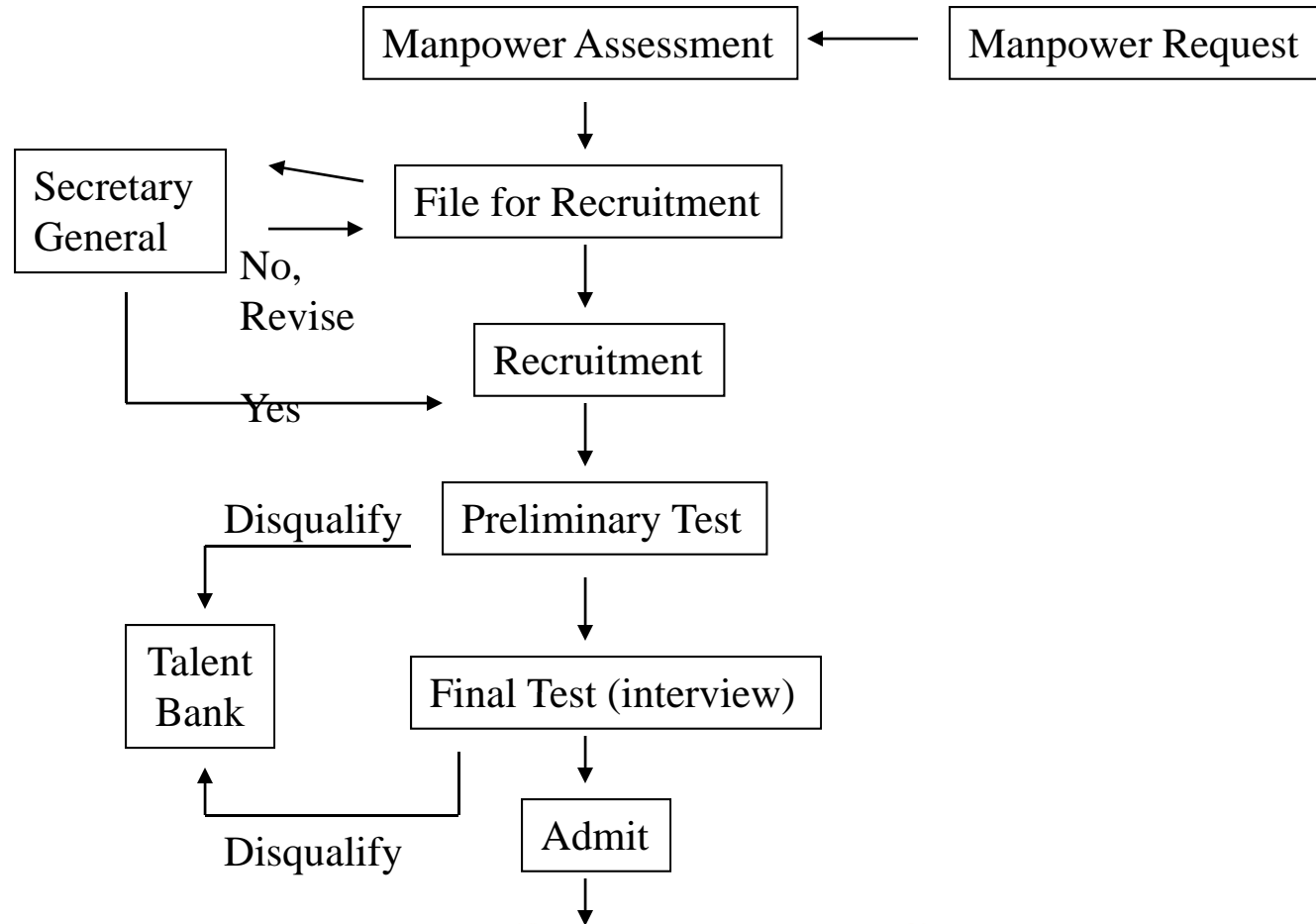
- **OECD: Definition of technical cooperation:** Includes grants to nationals of aid recipient countries receiving education or training at home or abroad

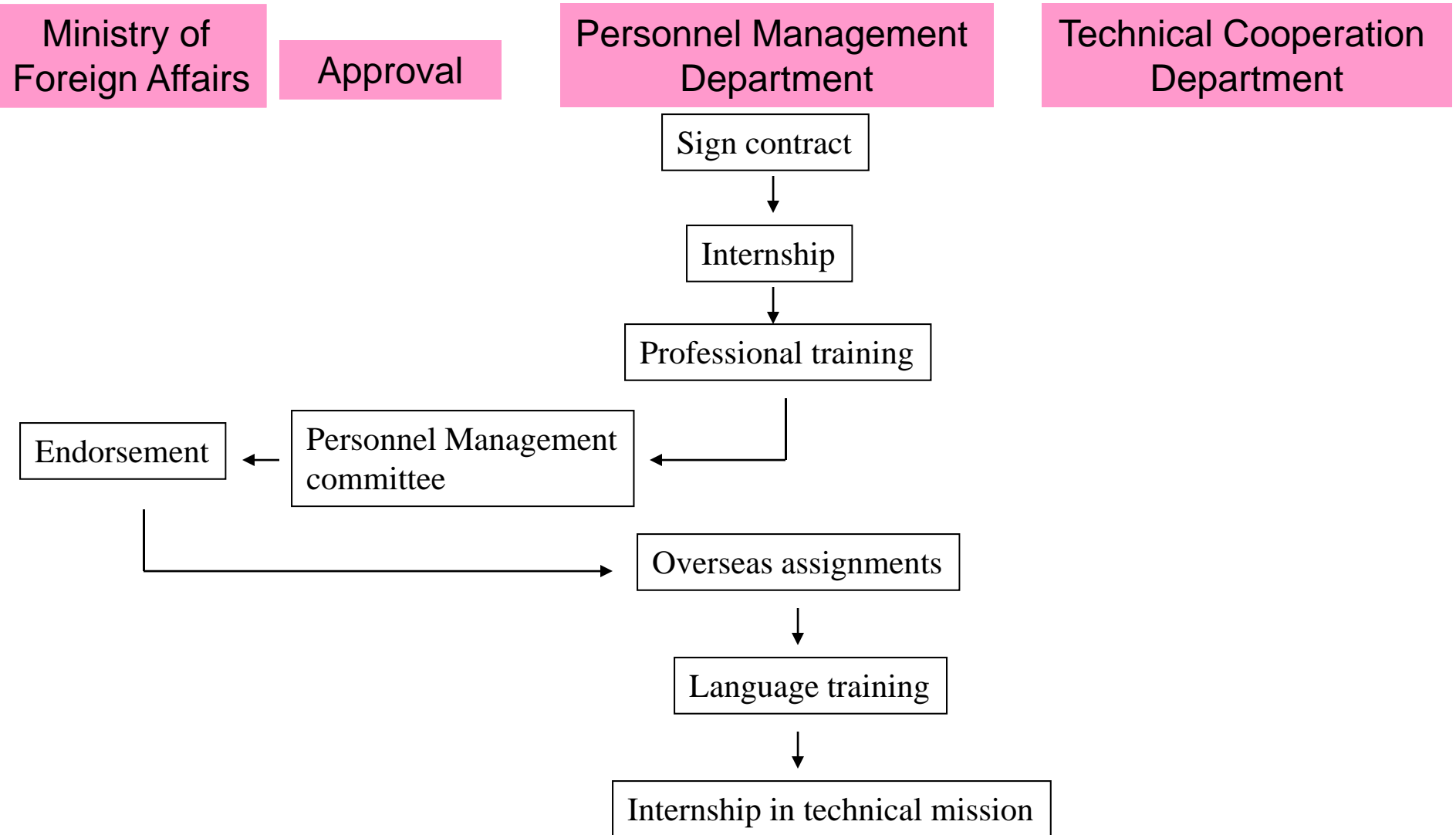

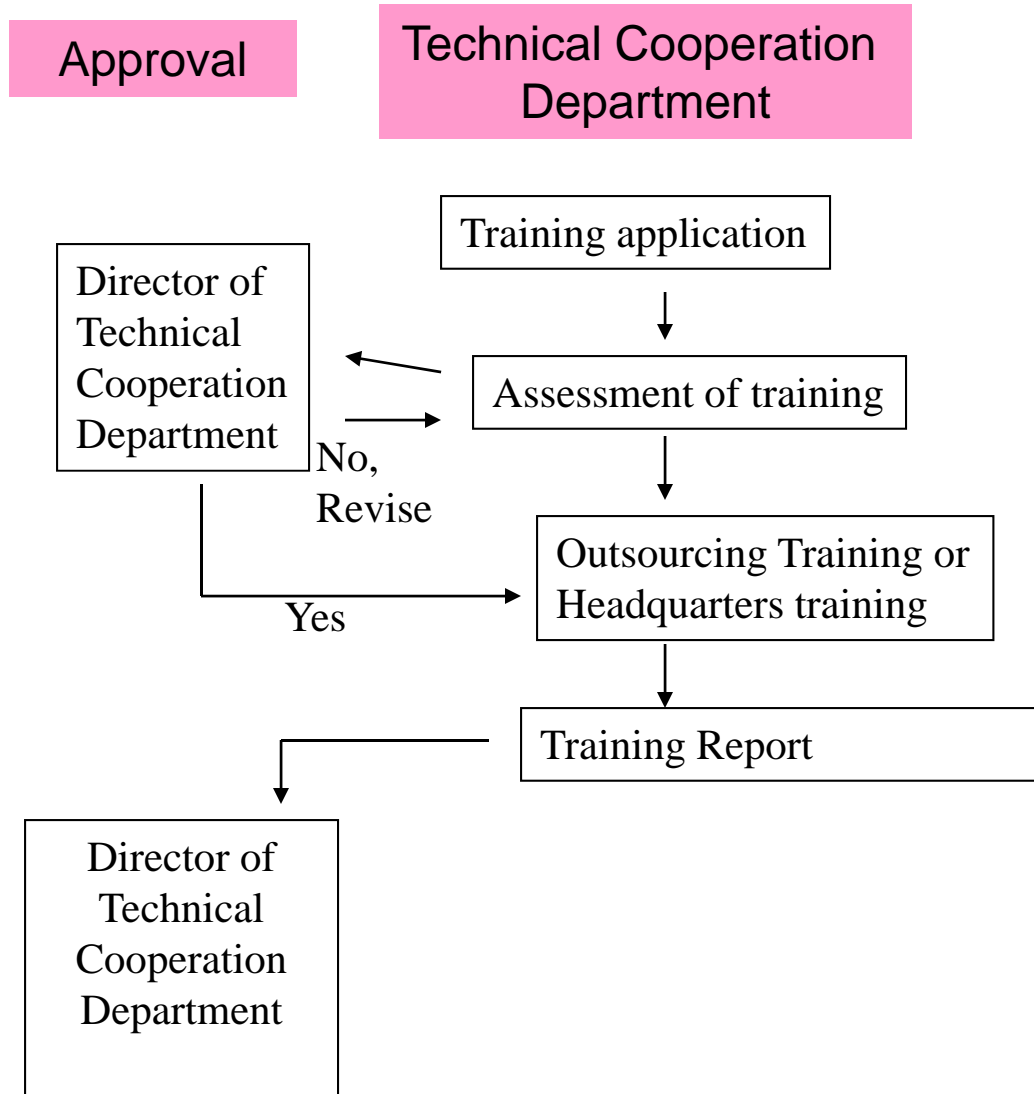

## Objectives

- a) Make use of agricultural decomposed remnants and donkey droppings to produce compost to hold soil moisture and nutrients
- b) **Train local people with producing compost skills**
- c) Reduce the burning amount of agricultural remnants and CO<sub>2</sub> emission

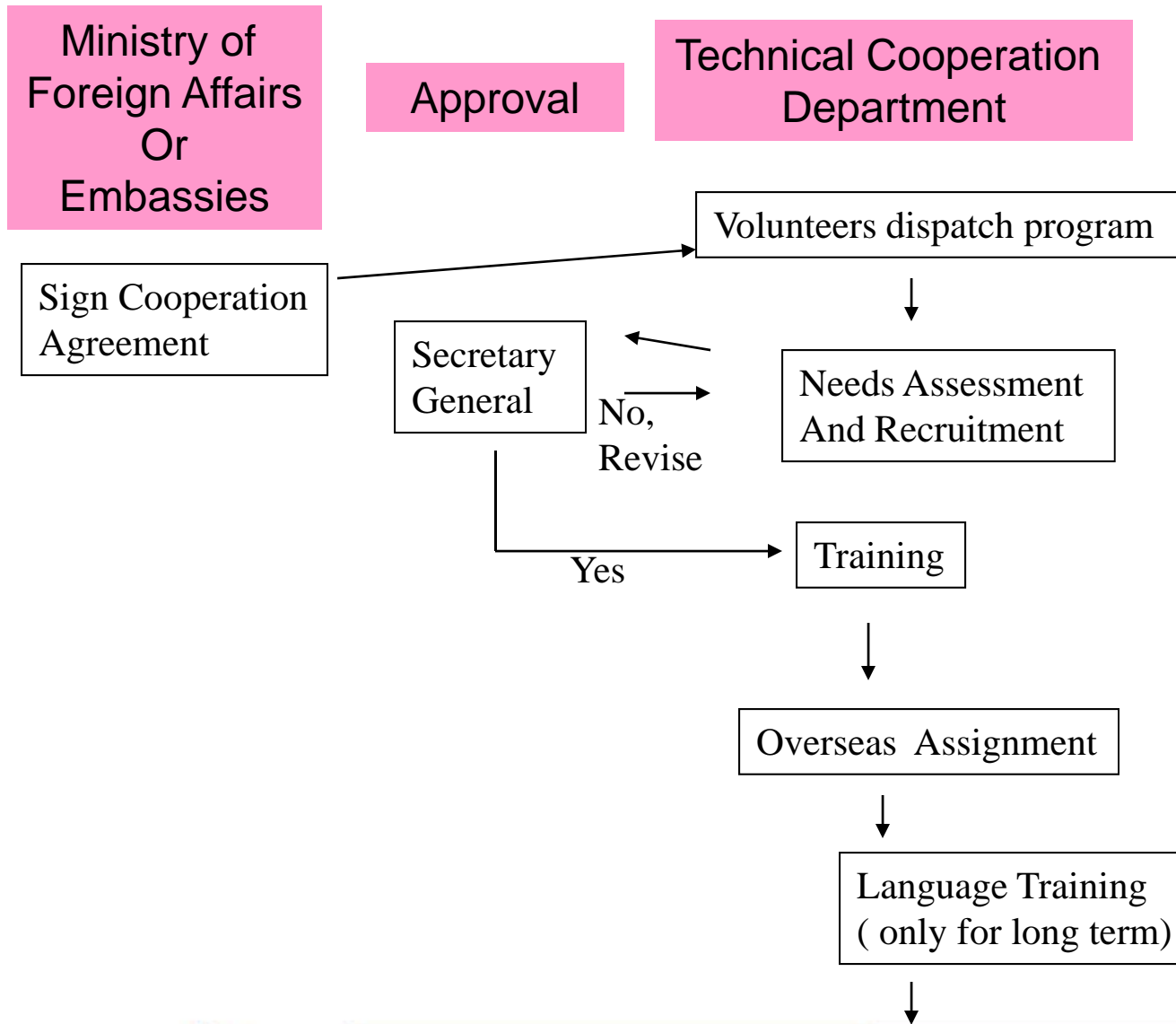

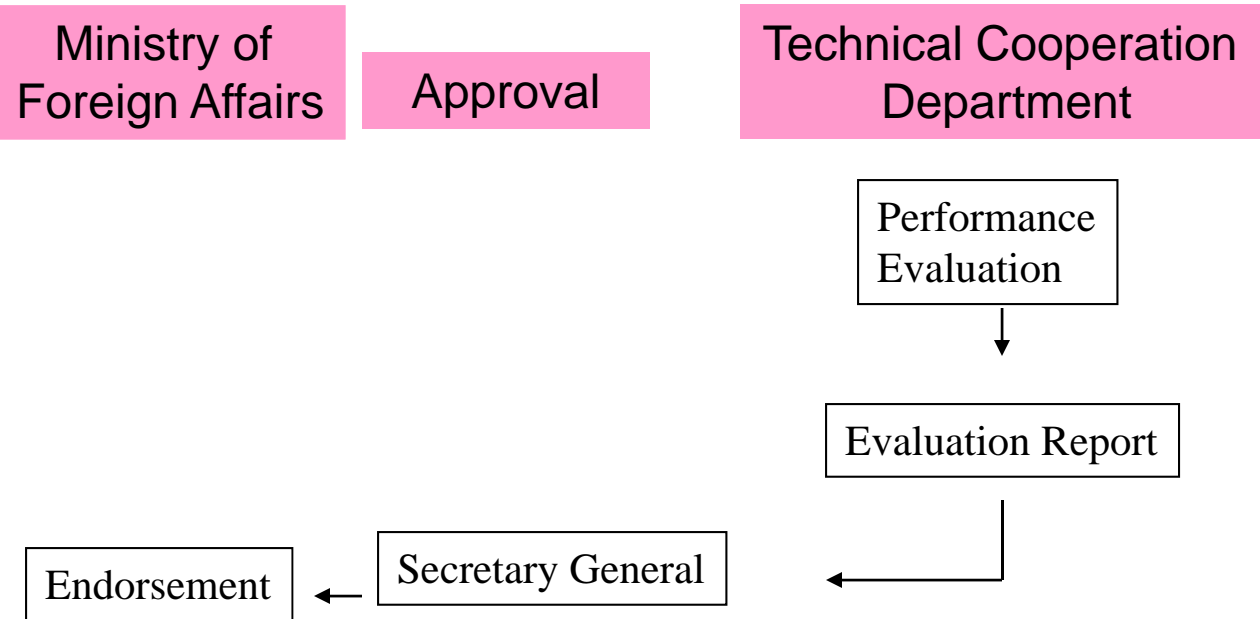
**Objectives**

# IV. Capacity Building

## ➤ Healthcare Personnel Training Program

Since 2005, the TaiwanICDF and the allied hospitals of IHCSA (International Healthcare Cooperation Strategic Alliance) has arranged 3 months clinical training for all kinds of healthcare personnel. In 2009, 33 participants coming from 19 partner countries are trained in 17 hospitals, and there are totally 115 participants successfully completed their training in Taiwan.

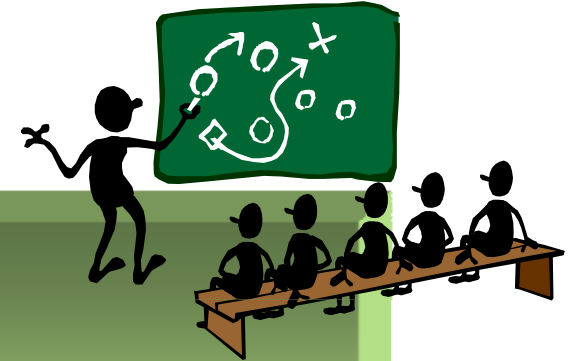

**The TaiwanICDF human resources development operations are devoted to the training of personnel needed by allied and friendly countries for their economic and social development.**

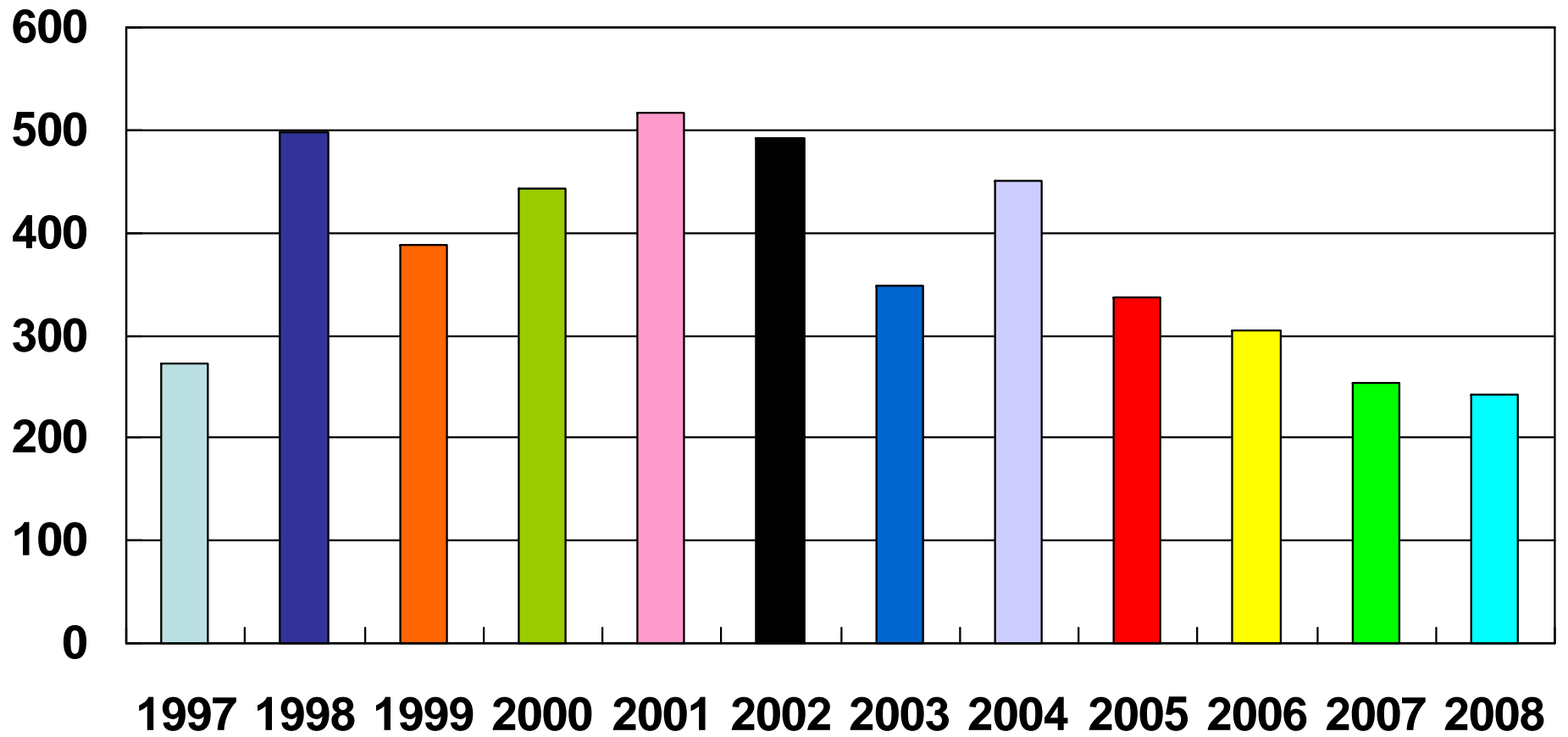
**As of September 2009, A total of 198 workshops and seminars were held in which 4,738 government officials from 105 countries came to Taiwan for training from 1997.**

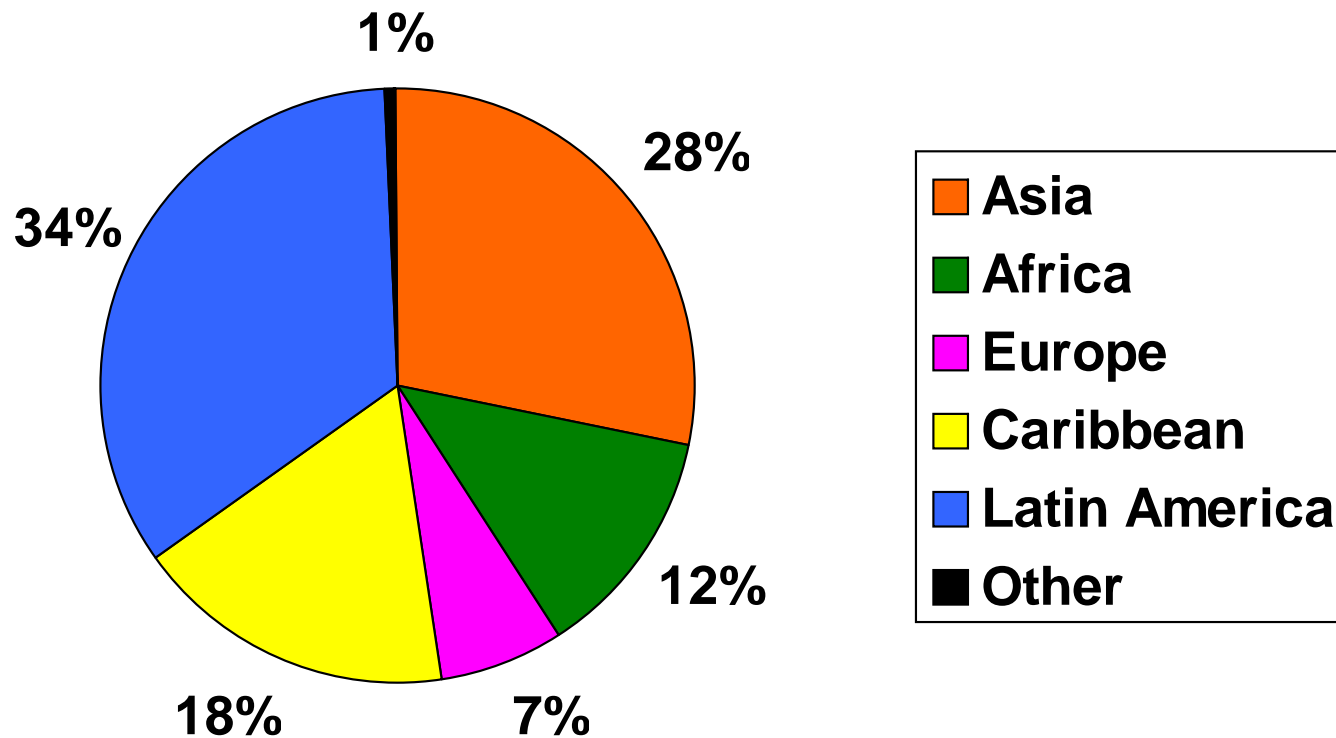

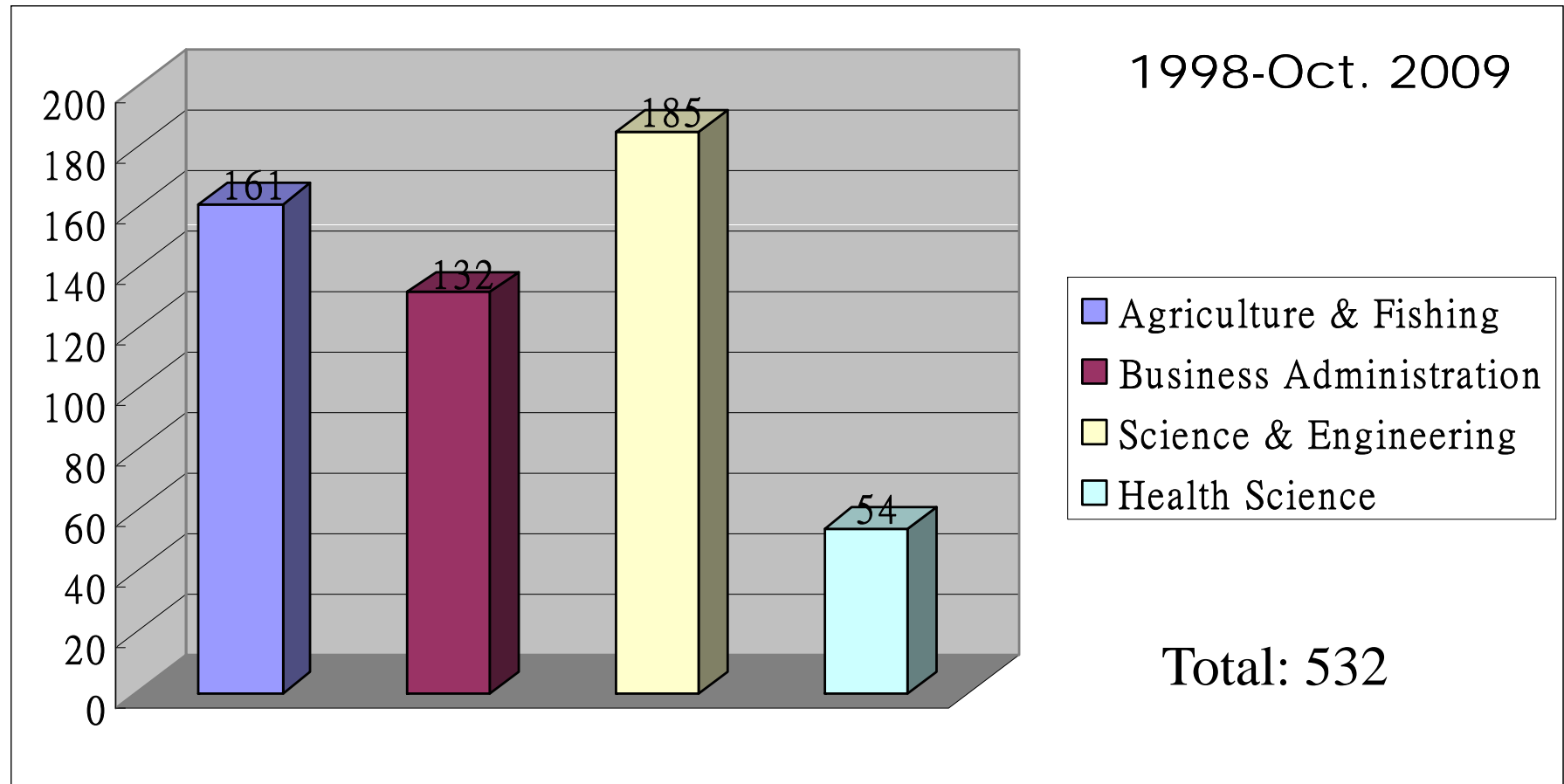

# Higher Education Scholarship Programs

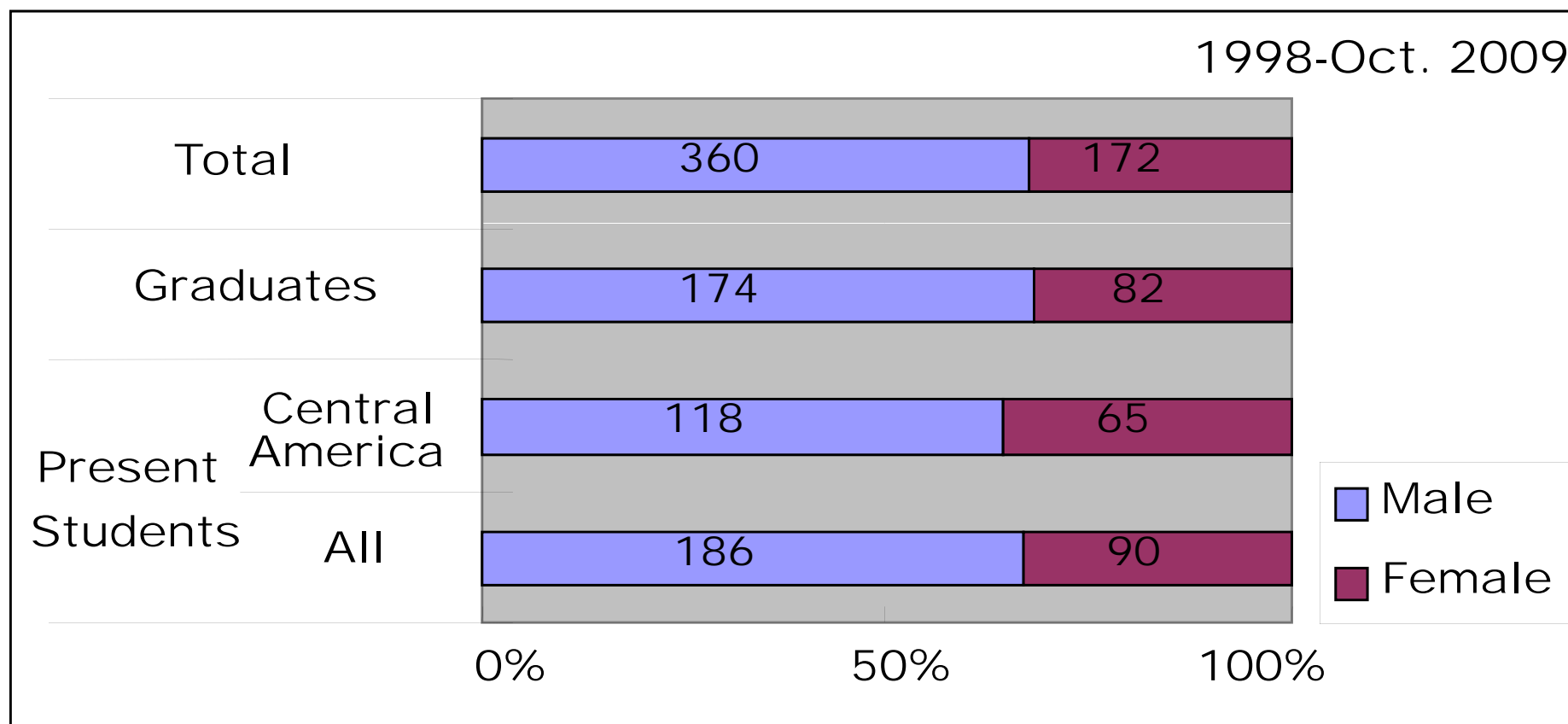
Since 1998, the TaiwanICDF began cooperating with NPUST's Institute of Tropical Agriculture and International Cooperation on providing scholarships for master's degrees.

By Oct. 2009, the TaiwanICDF has a cooperation program with 16 universities in 24 fields of study, providing undergraduate and graduate programs. By September 2009, there is a total of 532 students joining in this program with 256 graduates.

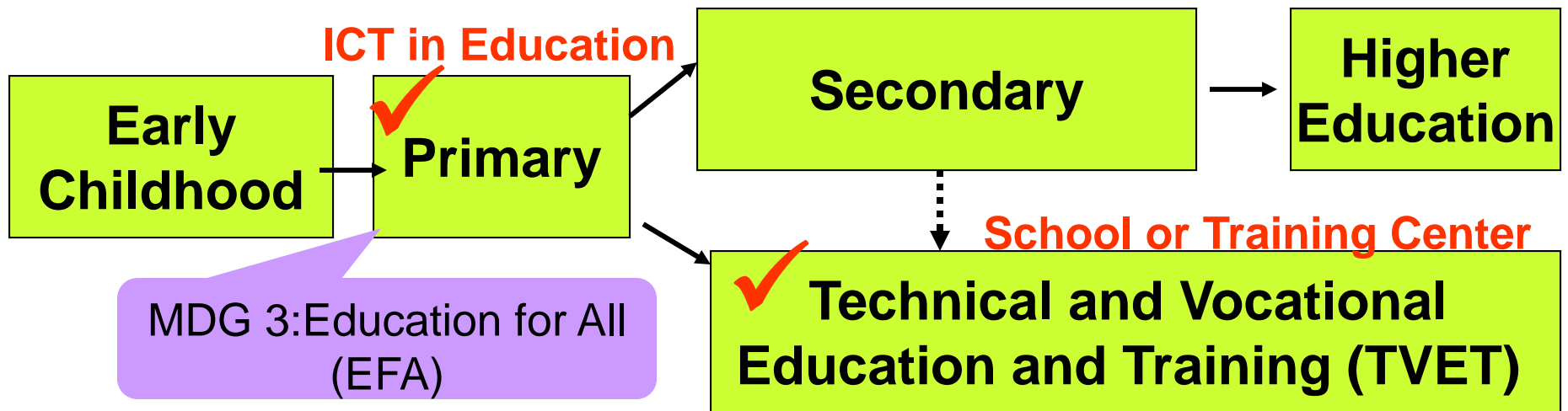
